*Ship models--Catalogs*  
*Ships, Ancient--Egypt*  
*Funeral rites and ceremonies--Egypt*  
*Tombs--Egypt*

For guidelines about writing it may be helpful to look at Sylvan Barnet's *A Short Guide to Writing about Art*, which includes tips for looking, reading, and writing about art.
