On April 15, 2019, the world watched in grief as fire engulfed the Cathedral of Notre-Dame, a landmark in the center of Paris since construction began in 1163 on the site of a Roman temple. In 1991 UNESCO designated it a World Heritage Site, a space not only sacred to Catholics,

but also a cultural testament to eight centuries of history, art, and architecture that drew from a dynamic, multicultural, and religiously diverse medieval world.

Its reopening in December 2024 has come to mean more than reconstruction: It is a spectacular Our events centered
